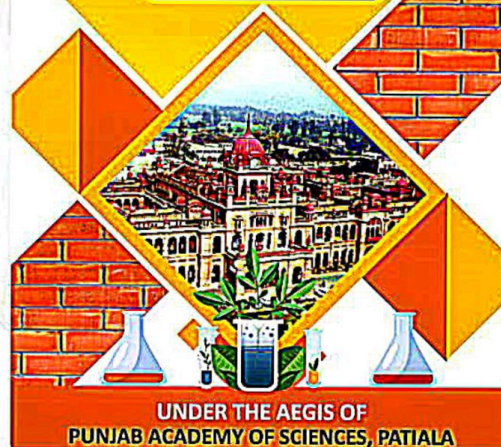

PRESENTATION (ORAL/POSTER)

There will be parallel technical sessions for oral presentations for each thrust area (Online mode available for participants of other states). Ten minutes shall be given for oral presentation (seven minutes for presentation and three minutes for discussion). For poster presentation, each participant will be provided with a space of 30" x 36" inch for displaying the written material, diagrams, photographs etc. Best poster in each section will be awarded a medal, certificate and a prize of Rs. 2100/- by the Punjab Academy of Sciences.

YOUNG SCIENTIST AWARD

A special offline session for the presentation of papers for the young scientist award will be held on February 8, 2025. Young scientists up to the age of 35 years on December 31, 2024 may send their abstracts and full length papers to the Secretary, Punjab Academy of Sciences, Union Building, Punjabi University, Patiala, separately on or before December 31, 2024. Name of the Section pertaining to the paper should be clearly mentioned on the envelope. One additional Young Scientist award will be given to the person who present his/her research in Punjabi Language. The abstract of this paper should be submitted online at pasciences@gmail.com. The Young scientists (proof of age to be furnished) selected for best presentation will be awarded a certificate of honor, medal and cash prize of Rs. 7500/-. The online mode available for the participants of other States.

ABOUT KHALSA COLLEGE, AMRITSAR

Khalsa College was established in 1892 with the main objective to spread the benefits of modern education in Humanities, Agriculture, Science and Technology amongst the people of Punjab. College campus covers an area of over 300 acres and provide latest facilities for higher education. Its architectural features are a mix of British, Mughal and Sikh architect. Khalsa College's contribution towards the freedom history of India is significant as it has generated many famous freedom fighters, political leaders, armed forces generals, scientists, famous players-olympians, actors, writers, journalists and scholars. In 1930, a Sikh Research Centre was founded within the college and Dr. Ganda Singh headed it until 1947. The Sikh Research Centre of Khalsa College has since grown to encompass a library and art galleries, containing thousands of artefacts, books, manuscripts, and paintings related to Sikhs and Sikhism. The current collection is 6,397 books, 375 paintings, 601 manuscripts, newspapers dating back to 1904, 675 files/books/journals, coinage, historical photographs, and weaponry. The college has been conferred the autonomous status affiliated to Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar. College is NAAC Accredited with 'A+' Grade and Conferred with 'College with Potential for Excellence' status by UGC and 'Star Status' by the DBT. Presently, the college is running 71 Post-graduate and Undergraduate programmes.

ABOUT CITY OF AMRITSAR

Amritsar is the largest and most famous city in Punjab and is a major commercial, cultural, and transportation centre. It is also the centre of Sikhism and the site of the Sikhs' principal place of worship-the Harmandir Sahib, or Golden Temple. It lies about 15 miles (25km) east of the border with Pakistan. Amritsar not only is home to hundreds of thousands of Sikhs but also is the chief pilgrimage destination for Sikhs living elsewhere in India and abroad. A short distance away from the Golden Temple complex is a spacious park, Jallianwala Bagh, where on April 13, 1919, British colonial government troops fired on a crowd of unarmed Indian protesters, killing 379 of them and wounding many more. Amritsar is a centre for the textile and chemical industries and also engages in food milling and processing, silk weaving, tanning, canning, and the manufacture of machinery. The city lies on the main highway from Delhi to Lahore, Pakistan, and is a major rail hub. Other tourist attraction in Amritsar are Jallianwala bagh, Durgiana Temple and of course the Khalsa College, Amritsar.

PUNJAB ACADEMY OF SCIENCES

The Punjab Academy of Sciences came into existence during the 83rd session of the Indian Science Congress at Punjabi University, Patiala in 1996. It provides a platform where senior scientists and young researchers in the region meet and interact in order to share their expertise in different disciplines of Science & Technology.
